From The Principal

As we reach the end of yet another school year, it is time for students to reflect on the past terms effort and learning and give thought to their possible learning goals for next year. This Term we have supported students to celebrate their achievements and identify areas for growth which will be reflected in their end of semester reports.

There are many challenges that our students have faced this year, one being able to continue their learning in the face of a worldwide pandemic, school closures, lockdowns, and facemasks. Throughout all this, it has meant our students have had to remain positive towards their learning but also adapt to the challenges that are presented – remote online learning. For many of our students, this has required the development of a 'growth mindset.'

Students with a growth mindset believe that their essential qualities and abilities are things they can cultivate through effort and persistence. This mindset leads not only to a passion for learning and personal development, but also confidence and a resilient sense of self in the face of adversity and criticism. We can develop and foster this mindset by being open to accepting feedback on work in draft form or after assessment, but also through thinking about how we behave as learners.

For many students, our actions as learners require us to remain appropriately challenged during class time. If the work being carried out is too easy, this leads to boredom and little learning. If the work is too difficult, this causes frustration and students give up and do not try to continue. The challenge is for students to find that middle ground where new learning is not overly easy, but also not too demanding and with a little extra effort and perseverance can achieve. We all need to find and manage our learning to remain in this ideal zone of learning.

As we prepare for the 2022 school year, I would like to make all families aware of an important change to our school days. Working with our school community and Governing Council, our Education Director has approved the reinstatement of an early dismissal on a Wednesday afternoon. This means students in the **Primary and Secondary schools** will be **dismissed at 2:15pm every Wednesday** from week 1, Term 1, 2022. To make up for this shorter day, these **students will be dismissed at 3:05pm on the other days** (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday). On these days the **Preschool will finish at 3:10pm**. All students across the school (Preschool, Primary and Secondary) will have **a common start time of 8:40am**. We know this will make managing those drop-off and pickup times far more convenient.

Avenues College Uniform Items ~ 2022

All students are expected to wear full school uniform. It promotes pride in presentation, supports equity principles and allows staff to provide care to students who are immediately recognisable as Avenues College students. Our Governing Council support a whole school uniform policy.



Avenues College uniforms are provided by Devon Clothing. While the contract with Devon provides a convenient and value-for-money outcomes to the school community, parents do have the option to purchase non logo uniform items from any other supplier, providing that the uniform items are exactly the same as the items identified within the school's uniform policy.

We provide a safe learning environment, we value safety guidelines specified by Department for Education, Department for Industry and the Work, Health and Safety Act. Guidelines regarding clothing, footwear and eye protection are explained to students attending practical courses. It is recommended that hats will be worn outdoors for sun protection. Within the building, headgear is to be removed unless required to be worn for cultural or religious reasons.
