From the beginning of 2021 we will welcome all students boarding at Wiltja into our classes at Avenues College, from years 8-12. This move from Woodville High School will see a number of changes to our staffing arrangements, with additional staff members joining us and providing EALD and Aboriginal learning expertise.

During the first week in November I visited the APY Lands with Daniel Lasscock and Cheryl Arthur.

Daniel will become the Deputy Principal of Avenues College next year, with responsibility for Aboriginal Learners Reception to Year 12 and the Senior School.

This was a valuable opportunity to meet families, school leaders and community members ready for the changes to our community for 2021.

Our year 12 students have completed exams and the last couple of assignments for their SACE. 

2020 NAIDOC WEEK POSTER WINNER

'SHAPE OF LAND'
TYROWN WAIGANA



Tyrown Waigana, a Perth based artist and designer, has been named as this year's winner of the prestigious National NAIDOC Poster Competition.

According to the 23-year-old, his winning entry depicts the Rainbow Serpent coming out of the Dreamtime to create this country and how we are strongly connected to it.

"The Rainbow Serpent is represented by the snake and it forms the shape of Australia, which symbolises how it created our lands. The colour from the Rainbow Serpent is reflected on to the figure to display our connection to the Rainbow Serpent, thus our connection to country. The overlapping colours on the outside is the Dreamtime."

"The figure inside the shape of Australia is a representation of Indigenous Australians showing that this country - since the dawn of time - always was, and always will be Aboriginal land," Mr Waigana added.

Celebrating NAIDOC Week at Avenues College includes:

- Students working with Aboriginal artist Scott Rathman, Rusted Tin to produce a College mural on the Multi-Arts building about connection to place. The mural reflects that friendships are what makes students feel a sense of belonging at the College.

We have been very busy at preschool! We were introduced to some very friendly animals at our Animals Anonymous Incursion.




